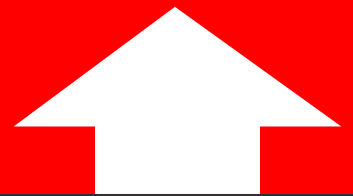


COVID-19 ALERT: VERY HIGH RISK



DUE TO WIDER SPREAD OF COVID-19 [COMMUNITY] IS MOVING UP TO LEVEL 4 ON JUNE 21.

Widespread outbreak that is growing with many undetected cases. Take strong measures to limit all contact.

Why are we **INCREASING** the COVID-19 alert to Level 43:

HIGH RISK?

[Community] has seen cases increase to xx,xxx on June 18, including spread within the community and without additional protective action, the outbreak will spread.

What new protections should you take?

We are asking everyone to limit everyday activities that expose them to large groups, including most travel. Large gatherings such as concerts will be cancelled. You can expect businesses and schools to take additional safety measures, such as physically-distanced seating. High-risk individuals should stay at home or shelter in place. Everyone should continue to wear masks in public, isolate if sick, wash hands, cover coughs and clean surfaces.

How long will this last?

When we see fewer cases and trace the effective spread, we can reduce

- **General public** should continue to avoid reduce non-essential travel and attend only small gatherings
- Businesses and schools can safely open with precautions
- **High-risk individuals** should stay at home or shelter whenever possible

Alert level 2

Moderate number of cases with most cases from a known source.

Alert level 1

Cases are rare and contact tracing can be used to control the virus.

Why are we DECREASING the COVID-19 alert to Level 3:

HIGH RISK?

[Community] has seen cases decrease since May 10. New hospitalizations have decreased, and ICU capacity is sufficient.

What protections should you continue to take?

We are asking everyone to limit everyday activities that expose them to large groups, including most travel. Large gatherings such as concerts will remain cancelled. Businesses and schools can reopen with additional safety measures, such as physically-distanced seating. High-risk individuals should stay at home or shelter in place. Everyone should continue to wear masks in public, isolate if sick, wash hands, cover coughs and clean surfaces.

How long will this last?

We will continue to monitor COVID-19 cases in the community. If cases and hospitalizations continue to decrease after TIME, the risk level will be lowered. If they begin to increase again, the risk level may be raised.
